

# NON-PROFIT SPOTLIGHT

There are so many incredible organizations right here in our community doing important work, it's easy to lose track of all the impact they're making. That's why we're excited to introduce our Non-Profit Spotlight — a way to bring some of these organizations and their recent projects or expanding programs to the forefront. Each quarter, we'll share a few stories to help you stay connected with the positive changes happening in our backyard.

#### BURKE UNITED CHRISTIAN MINISTRIES

Many of you are familiar with BUCM, a vital resource for our community. In 2023 alone, they provided over 1,116,000 pounds of food and donated diapers to more than 460 families. Their mission is to restore resilience in people living in poverty or facing homelessness by ensuring their basic needs are met — and the numbers speak for themselves. We're proud to see them making such a significant impact.


This year, BUCM has an exciting move ahead to the "Old Food Lion Building," where they'll be able to expand their services even further. With this move comes exciting renovations, but also significant expenses. To support this growth, BUCM has launched a \$5 million capital campaign and is already over 68% of the way there! They anticipate the move to take place in Spring 2025, and we're excited to watch their continued progress as they work to better serve our community.

### WAITING FOR THE TRAIN

Passenger train service in Western NC was discontinued in the 1970s, but a recent grassroots movement is working to bring it back. In 2023, two new residents in Morganton began discussing the nightly sound of the freight train whistle that echoed through their neighborhood, sparking a much larger effort.

After learning about the Western NC Rail Committee's work to restore passenger rail, the two neighbors reached out to others in the community, including the local mayor. Together, they founded Waiting For The Train, a citizens' group advocating for the return of passenger rail to Western NC.

Passenger rail service is seen as an essential part of the region's future, offering economic benefits, environmental preservation, and fostering deeper human connections. The group is excited to be part of the Service Development Plan, a crucial step in making this dream a reality. They're looking forward to seeing the return of passenger rail — and so are we!

Priority will be given to programs that specifically address mental health challenges affecting children and families.

April 7, 2025 – Burke Women's Fund (BWF) will also open their annual grant cycle, supporting organizations that impact the lives of women and families in Burke County. Please note, applications will only be accepted for programs or projects with a minimum size of \$5,000.


